The Eleventh Annual Report of the Club, together with the audited Financial Statement for the twelve months ended 30th June, 1953, are presented by the Committee for your consideration and adoption.

MEMBERSHIP.

The total membership of the Club now stands at 74 compared with 72 for the season 1951-52.

Although the overall increase is small, it is very gratifying to note the active members now form 50.7% of the total membership, compared to 45.8% last year. Junior membership dropped mainly because last year's juniors who aspired to the senior ranks were not re-placed it is to be hoped that during the coming season, this branch of the Club membership can be built to a formidable number.

The coverted President's Point score was won by Vice-Captain, Des Cahill, after a very keen struggle.

INTER CLUB COMPETITIONS.

The Club competed in the Australian and State Championships, as well as the usual Inter Club carnivals, At the State Championships, the Club used it's new March Past Costumes, for the first time, and this added somewhat to the enthusiasm of members, although unplaced, our team marched extremely well, and we look forward to better deeds in the season that is ahead.

TERRIGAL VISITS.

The interchange of visits between Garie and Terrigal lapsed this season for the first time in several years. This was due mainly, to the fact that several Terrigal members were in Tasmania on an instructional tour at the time when the visits are usually held. We made up for the position somewhat, by visiting Terrigal on our return from the State Championships. The Terrigal members helped us with our accommodation for the night, and we competed in a very successful carnival on the beach the following day.

It is hoped that during the coming season, these popular visits will be revived as they are too good to be missed.

NO. 1 DISTRICT POINT SCORE.

This Competition was again keenly contested by Garie (the holders), Era, and Burning Palms. Unfortunately, we did not acquit ourselves as well as in previous years and we had to be content to watch Era and Burning Palms fight out the finish. After these two Clubs had won a Carnival each, the decider was fought out at Burning Palms; here, the "Palms Star allrounder", Keith Little, put up a wonderful performance, but he had his colours lowered in the all important belt race, and so the No. 1 District Point score returned to Era. We would like to take this opportunity of congratulating Era on their win. The entire series was fought out in the traditionally friendly atmosphere that has grown between the three Clubs over the years, and when we see the Trophy go from one Club to another, it only tends to sharpen our keenness to try and win it back a gain next time.

ANNUAL CARNIVAL.

Our Seventh Annual Surf Carnival was held on the 7th December, 1952, In contrast to the boisterous surf which prevailed in 1951, the waves were a little on the flat side for the boats, but the body shoots were ideal, and the wave that E. Gill cracked to win the Junior Surf

Race, will long be remembered by those who saw it. The weather was perfect and the carnival organisation was first class, all events ran to time and the last race finished in plenty of time to allow visitors to make their way homewards.

All members worked hard to make the day a successful one and they are to be congratulated on the way they co-operated to erect and dismantle the carnival area also for their help in organising car parking. Special mention should be given to Jack Hancock, who organised the carnival; Jack has taken on this unenviable task for the past few years, and he is continually striving to improve on his already first class efforts, we all think he has reached the stage where there is no more room for improvement, because the carnival is now acknowledged as one of the best organised on the coast

On this occasion, we were honoured with the presence of Mr. K. W. Flokheart (Trustee), and Miss L. M. Ballhausen (Secretary), of the National Park Trust, their interest in our work is greatly appreciated.

KINDRED CLUBS.

To Era and Burning Palms, we tender our sincere thanks for their help and co-operation during the past season. When vandals damaged our Clubhouse, during the 1952 Winter, Burning Palms immediately offered financial help, this was greatly appreciated. On our visits to both beaches to compete in carnivals, we were entertained royally after the events, and to the ladies who provided the refreshments, we wish to say "thank you". The neighbourly spirit runs strongly through us and we hope that the No. 1 District will always be "all for one and one for all".

SOCIAL.

The three major social events of the year are the Annual Ball, the Championship Golf Day, and the Presentation Dinner; as these events are being held late in June, and

this report has to be typed, printed, and circulated by Mid-July, the comment on these functions cannot be included. The arrangements are well in hand for all three and it is a confident wish that as you read this report, your mind will flash back to these functions and fill with memories of three good times spent with your fellow members. LIFE MEMBER.

During the season, a colour photograph of the Club's first Life Member, H. G. "Binky" Hawker, was presented to the Club by one of our Vice Presidents, Mr. MacKenzie. The photograph shows "Binky" in March Past costume alongside the boat of which he has been Captain for so many years and is a fitting tribute to one who has done so much for the Club since its inception. Our thanks are due to Mr. MacKenzie for making it possible.

CLUB TRANSPORT.

At the commencement of the season, the National Park Trust informed the Club that it could no longer make available a truck to transport members to and from the beach. As an alternative, they offered to subsidise a special bus from Waterfall to the beach. Mr. Cunningham, leasee of the kiosk at Garie Beach, also offered to subscribe towards the cost of the bus.

As the hire of a bus is rather an expensive item we are very grateful for Mr. Cunningham's practical help.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT.

Another year has gone by and the Club has pulled through many difficult situations. Such difficulties as the vandalism already mentioned, the lack of transport to the beach, etc., have failed to deter the members from their primary duty, that of Life-saving.

The majority of the Club members have bucked in and done all the work required of them, plus the little extra laid upon them by lax members. The members who appear to be in the Club only for the privileges offered, are but few, and I think this section of the Club is fast diminishing.

The competition inside the Club, has been "A-1", and it is no fault of ours, but the ability of kindred Clubs that has caused the No. 1 District Inter Club Competition to swing in favour of Era, this year.

At major competitions, the newly formed March Past Team, fitted out with new costumes, must be complimented. Keep at it chaps, the Club will benefit much by your efforts.

That, of course, is dependant upon our transport difficulties being overcome.

We did not suffer damage to any great extent to boat or gear during the past season, which is commendable to

the crews in charge, considering there were some fair seas running at times.

It was a great shock to members to hear of the unfortunate accident in which Jim Walsh lost his life recently. He was one of the Club's best boat men who lacked nothing when it came to courage and grit. I cannot praise him enough for spirit in which he carried out his duties.

Finally, I wish to thank the members for their assistance throughout the season past, and hope that with a couple of new sweep hands available, they will show a keener interest for the work in the one to follow.
